

Scientific name: Phoca vitulina

Canadian distribution: Atlantic (P. v. concolor),

Pacific (P. v. richardsi) et Northern Québec (P. v. mellonae)

IN BRIEF

The **subspecies** *P. v. mellonae* is the only strictly freshwater population of harbour seals in the world and is designated as **endangered** in Canada.

The life expectancy is 30 to 35 years for females and 20 to 25 years for males.

The harbour seal feeds abundantly on **fish** (cod, capelin, herring), and **invertebrates**.

Northern lexicon

Marine mammal

Pinnipeds: from the Latin *pinna* for fins and *pes* for feet.

Group of aquatic mammals including seals, walruses, and sea lions whose limbs are modified into flippers.

There are species of seals in Canadian waters:

Harp seal, grey seal, hooded seal, harbour seal, ringed seal and bearded seal.



CLIMATE CHANGE

Climate change may be creating **new habitat** for harbour seals in the Arctic because, unlike ringed seals, they do not need ice to give birth to their pups.
